FEBRUARY 4, 2025 MINUTES - REGULAR MEETING

Council President Robert Smith called the February 4, 2025 regularly scheduled council meeting of the Biglerville Borough Council to order at 7:00 p.m. with the following in attendance:

• GLIEM MADE A MOTION TO AUTHORIZE KPI TO PUT TOGETHER THE 2024 CHAPTER 94 REPORT. ECKER SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

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 Gliem advised council the feasibility studies were completed for Monteleone and Biglerville Heights Phase 2. Zack stated there are enough EDUs for the connections for both projects and advised council to discuss keeping a certain amount of EDUs for the Borough itself. Smith asked Zack if he had a standard recommendation to keep for the Borough. Zack advised about 5-10% should be kept for the Borough, he also advised council to keep enough EDUs reserved so the capacity of the sewer plant is not met. Council concurred to discuss this in a further meeting.

WATER COMMITTEE: Ecker reported on:

• Ecker read the January water report

In January, our water system pumped a total of 2,705,000 gallons averaging 87,258 gal/day. That is a 5.9 % increase from January 2024 and a 12.7 % decrease from December 2024.

January's bacteria samples were taken on the 7th at 374 Heidlersburg Road (G.V.M.), 33 Musselman Ave. (borough office), and 110 South Main Street (7-11 store). First quarter PFOA-PFOS for all wells were sampled. Well #6 on the 13th, Well #5 on the 22nd and Well #7 on the 27th.

In January, Doug summitted D.E.P.'s annual water report (Act 110) for 2024. Also did the annual updates on the O&M plan, S.O.P. and Emergency Response Plan.

On February 3rd Dennis Reever & Ryan Plumbing replaced the customers side of the service lateral into the basement of the laundry mat at 16 South Main Street.

On February 2^{nd} , the gearbox went out on the chlorinator at Well #7. We used the chlorinator we bought for Well #6 to replace it. We repaired this gearbox a few times. It has been online since 1993. So now we need another one for Well #6.

Water /Wastewater Operator Doug Hays

- Ecker asked Craig Zack if there were any updates on the Pennvest loan or E. York Street water project. Zack replied and said the loan is on schedule to being settled and once the loan is settled, the project can move forward.
- Ecker asked Hays if the pump at Well #6 can wait another month to order a new one. Hays advised it can wait another month.
